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
I. Introduction

Christian spirituality is a way of life of disciples of Christ. It is the lived experience of God, rooted in the revealed word of God, grounded in community and illuminated by the rich tradition of the church. It is concerned with all of life, not merely piety and not exclusively prayer. It is both individual and corporate, churchly and worldly, inward and outward, concerned with personal relationship with God and with justice in the world. Further Christian spirituality is biblical and Trinitarian.

The Active Contemplative: The ways in which the work experience itself invites us to be contemplative and to be found by God:

 - e. Why is it so important for me to succeed?
 - f. Why am I unable to let go of the pain of others?
 - g. Why am I afraid to be alone, always seem to need people?
 - h. Why am I so discontent?

C. Spirituality THROUGH Work

Finally, the night watchman asked the rebbe, 'And who do you work for?' The rebbe answered, 'I'm not always sure. But this I will tell you. Name your present salary and I will double it.
